What is College Credit Plus?

- ❖ Opportunity for students to take college courses while in high school
- ❖ Available for college-ready, eligible students in Grades 7-12
- ❖ Earn both high school credit & college credit
- ❖ Promote rigorous academic pursuits
- ❖ Provide a wide variety of options for college-ready students
- ❖ Public Ohio colleges and universities-some private

Student Benefits

- ❖ Earn high school & college credit for your classes
- ❖ Courses appear on high school & college transcripts
- ❖ Reduce the time and cost to earning college credit
- ❖ Easy transfer of college credit
- ❖ Take college courses in familiar settings
- ❖ Get a head start on a college degree
- ❖ Gain exposure to college-level coursework while in high school

General Information

- ❖ High schools must provide two pathways for students to earn college credit
 - 15 hour pathway
 - 30 hour pathway
 - No obligation to take courses identified on these pathways or these colleges
- ❖ CCP courses will be the same courses as offered on the college campus to college students
- ❖ Students must be Ohio Residents
- ❖ 3 Semester Hours = 1 HS credit
 - 2 Semester Hours = $\frac{2}{3}$ HS credit
 - 1 Semester Hour = $\frac{1}{3}$ HS credit
- ❖ Maximum of 10 HS credits per academic year
 - 30 college credit hours
 - Includes summer term (summer is the first term of an academic year)
- ❖ Weighted Grades
 - AP weight for courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Art

College Readiness

- ❖ College readiness is determined by the college or university
 - ACT: English-18, Reading-22, Math-22
 - SAT: Reading & Writing-480, Math 530
 - College Placement Tests (ACCUPLACER, ALEKS, etc.)

- ❖ Students must apply to the college or university to participate in College Credit Plus

Financial Information and Costs

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

- ❖ Tuition
 - \$40- \$160 per credit hour

- ❖ Textbooks- School District Property
 - College Rentals will be returned to the bookstore
 - Return purchased books to Miamisburg High School
 - Books not returned will be charged to the student

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

- ❖ Transportation

- ❖ Parking

- ❖ A student with a failing grade at the end of the college course or dropping the college course after the drop date, will be required to reimburse the district for the tuition and textbook costs

Possible CCP Course Formats

- ❖ On the high school campus
 - Taught by a qualified high school teacher
 - Co-taught by a high school teacher & a college instructor
 - Online college course taught by a college instructor and proctored by a high school teacher
- ❖ On the college campus, taught by college instructor
- ❖ Online college course during school hours
- ❖ Online college course during non-school school hours

MHS Implementation

- ❖ Sinclair Community College
 - Courses built into the Master Schedule at MHS taught by MHS faculty
 - [2021-2022 MHS College Credit Plus Courses](#)
 - Students may register and attend courses on Sinclair's campus or online

- ❖ Students may attend courses on the campus or online of another choice college or university
 - Students are responsible for completing the application and registering at the college or university.

Student Process

- ❖ View Parent-Student Information Night
 - Access resources on the [College Credit Plus](#) page of the District Website
 - Course Selection with HS Counselor
- ❖ Turn in [Letter of Intent](#)
 - MHS Deadline is February 19th
 - Can be completed digitally
 - Return to School Counseling Office
- ❖ Apply to College
 - Sinclair- by May 1st
- ❖ Complete College Credit Plus Applications and Forms
 - ACT/SAT Scores
 - High School Transcript
 - Recommendation
- ❖ Take Placement Tests (if applicable)
 - Sinclair: Online testing information can be found [here](#)- must be done by March 19th for scheduling purposes (Sinclair deadline is June 15th)
 - Other colleges- students arrange

Already a CCP Student??

- ❖ You **MUST** complete a Letter of Intent
- ❖ If attending the same college, you do not need to apply again
- ❖ If attending a different college, you must follow that college's application process

Underperforming Students

CCP Probation

- ❖ A student is placed on CCP probation when he or she either:
 - Has earned lower than a cumulative 2.0 GPA in CCP courses
 - Or
 - Withdraws from, or receives no credit for two or more courses in the same term

- ❖ While on CCP probation, the student:
 - May only enroll in one CCP course for one college term (semester/quarter)
 - May not enroll in a college course in the same subject the student previously earned a D, F or received no credit

Underperforming Students

CCP Dismissal

- ❖ A student is placed on CCP dismissal when the student has failed to increase his or her GPA to 2.0 or above in the CCP courses during the probation term.
 - When placed on CCP dismissal, the student may not enroll in any CCP courses for the following term.
 - At the end of the dismissal term, the student can request to be reinstated in the program.
 - The student may appeal CCP dismissal within 5 days of being notified of dismissal status.
